God on Trial, Round 2
March 24, 2019
Luke 23:1-25

1. Why is it so difficult for us to embrace our true sinfulness? How does coming to grips with our sin actually lead us to joy?
2. Why does bowing to the Kingship of Jesus bring about disruption to our family, our relationships, etc.? Can we have Jesus and not experience disruption?
3. Herod seemed to dabble with religion. How can we know if we are simply dabbling or if we have said “I do” to Jesus?
4. What is the hardest thing about admitting our weakness? How does owning our weakness actually bring us to a place of real strength?
5. We tend to conform to that group we most want to be a part of. How do you feel when you perceive that you are outside the bounds of that group? Why is the pull to conform so strong?
6. Imagine if you can that you are on death row. How would you feel if the jailer came, unlocked your cell door, and informed you that you are free, that someone else would take your place at the execution? What would you feel like you owe that person, especially knowing that he was innocent? What do we now owe to King Jesus?
7. Coming to Jesus as King is a costly move in many respects. We can't come to Him without paying that cost. Yet, what do we get in return as citizens in His Kingdom? How do those benefits compare to the cost to us?

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
