The Power of 4-D Love

Ephesians 3:14-21

- 1.) Do you hope to do great or memorable things? Is that self-centered or prideful?
HINT: If our goal is personal fame and pleasure, then of course it can be wrong. But don't forget God has created us in his image and has promised to use us for good works beyond even our own expectations. Be honest about whose glory you are seeking!
- 2.) What is something that seems way beyond your comfort or ability that God's great love might enable or motivate you to do?
- 3.) Do you struggle with feeling that what you do every day doesn't make a difference? Share something "ordinary" that you do and let others in the group encourage you with how God might use your ordinary deeds to do something that really matters.
HINT: Don't forget that no matter what you come up with, God is able to work even beyond what we are able to imagine.
- 4.) What was the point of the HDTV illustration? What helps you move a theoretical understanding of God's love into an experience that changes everyday situations?
- 5.) What is most helpful to you in expanding your vision of the love of God?
- 6.) Share with the group what you wrote down during the sermon for how God has shown his love to you and to someone else you know.
- 7.) How has another part of the body of Christ helped expand your vision for the dimensions of God's love ("together with all the saints")?
- 8.) What would it look like corporately for us (Southwood) to have a transforming experience of the 4-D love of God? What would we do? How would it feel? What would our priorities be?
- 9.) How does the Lord's Supper enlarge your vision of God's love for you?
