Let's Stay Together

Hebrews 10:24-25; 3:12-13

1. Recapping the last two weeks, express some ways in which it is difficult to immerse yourself in Gospel community because of your experiences of confession and/or forgiveness? This is to ask, how has being vulnerable about sinning and being sinned against caused you to mistrust God's promises of abandoning ourselves to each other?
2. What is the Holy Spirit's role in facilitating and fostering Christian relationships? (Although the answers to this question can vary and be helpful in that variance, I am shooting for the reality of the Holy Spirit working in us as individuals and amongst us as a corporate body. This primary reliance is what can allow us to freely attempt to live in the manner to which we are called.)
3. In your life experience, what are some idols which have derailed your commitment to God and his people?
4. Considering what you have been taught about God's faithfulness, how can you express, in a manner in which you will be heard, the need for Christians to gather together to your peer group? Since we ought to be committed to generational learning, how can you be heard by a younger generation? How can you learn from them? How can you be heard by an older generation? How can you learn from them?
5. There is an obvious bit of nuance to be worked out when considering what appropriate commitment to Gospel community looks like. Discuss areas that appear to not be so black and white when discussing this issue. (Vacation, family time, mental health, recreational activity, idolatry of Church activities, etc)

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
