- 1.) Will said, "We don't pray because we trust ourselves more than we trust God." How do you see this struggle practically in your own life?
- 2.) Describe to a child what it means that we are to have a posture of trust, of constant communal dependence upon God. How would you tell the child what it means to have a relationship with God?
- 3.) How do you pray for others? How do you know what to pray for others? What does this require in our relationships, particularly within the family of God?
- 4.) Reflect on God's provision for your needs in big and small ways in your life. How does your gratitude for this promote trust for today and tomorrow?
- 5.) Paul Miller said, "If you are not praying, then you are quietly confident that time, money, and talent are all you need in life. You'll always be a little too tired, a little too busy. But if, like Jesus, you realize you can't do life on your own, then no matter how busy, no matter how tired you are, you will find the time to pray. Time in prayer makes you even more dependent on Go because you don't have as much time to get things done." In what ways is this convicting? How does it help you as you consider your life of prayer?
