3. Which promised change in Isaiah 9:1-5 most speaks to your heart in your current situation?

4. Which name of the promised Child-King in verse 6 most stirs you to love/worship/delight in Him in your current situation?

5. What does verse 7 tell us God is “zeal”ous about? How would you tell a friend struggling with hope what God’s burning commitment means in your own words?

6. How does God’s patient fulfilling of his promises over centuries and millennia encourage you in a place you’re struggling with hope today?
