1. Why would an unmarried person in the family of God need to read and apply these verses to their hearts and lives?
2. What crosses your mind when you think of submission? Why is it such a hard concept for us to consider doing in any context?
3. How does Jesus' submission to God the Father correct some of our modern misconceptions about submission?
4. How would you describe to a teenage girl or boy the beauty of the particular responsibility God has given her/him in a potential marriage? What would help her/him feel the weight and beauty of it rather than fear and shame?
5. Will said the men in Colosse may have been more ruffled by these verses than the women. Why might that have been, and why does agape love challenge you as a husband (or husbands you know)?
6. Failure, misuse, or neglect of love causes some of the deepest pain and scars in our lives. How does the Gospel offer hope and healing for these scars, and what are specific ways the church can be a part of that healing in hurting lives?
