- 3.) In your estimation, is it more important to teach those around you *how* to think as a Christian, or is it more important to teach them *what* to think as a Christian. Why?
- 4.) Discuss the differences between needing God as himself, and needing the good things that God gives us. What is good and bad about both of these?
- 5.) Peter spoke of the Holy Spirit as the way that trust is maintained between the Father and his people. What does it mean to "Fear the Lord, and turn away from evil" (Proverbs 3:7)? Of what benefit is this to believers?



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
