2 Kings 18:1-12

1. When we think of spiritual renewal or revival, what comes to mind? What kind of things do we typically want when we pray for revival? What evidence of revival do we look for?
2. What might be your modern equivalent of a “high place”? What high places do you most often frequent? What promises do they make that keep you going back?
3. Why can true renewal and revival not take place apart from tearing down our high places?
4. If you were to tear down those high places, how would it taste like death for you?
5. When Hezekiah began his reconstruction, he called the people to a Passover celebration. There they once again remembered who they were as a people, and whose they were. What does the Gospel say about your identity in Christ? List off as many things as you can (there are many). How does that help bring confidence and strength to face the death of our idols?
6. If left to ourselves, we have little hope of actually tearing down our high places. They are too close to our heart. What hope does the resurrection and the reign of King Jesus give us, that the work of reconstruction will be good and complete? Can you think of biblical promises that give us this hope?
