- 1.) The sermon spoke of Gentiles (those outside of Christ) living in the darkness of their ignorance of God. How does this knowledge affect the way we seek to evangelize them? If non-believers are blind and enslaved to their ignorance, what role does rational argument play in bringing them to Christ? What is ultimately required for them to come to the knowledge of Christ?
- 2.) In the sermon it was also said that the consolation that Jesus brings is glory to His people. How does that speak to your heart? How are guilt and shame different? In what ways do you hide from others? Is it hard to imagine that in Jesus we are truly, deeply beautiful? Why?
- 3.) How has Jesus been a disruption to your life? Can you give a specific example? How do you feel about Him playing that role?
- 4.) How can we trust Jesus, resting peacefully in Him, when He is bent on disrupting our schemes and agendas? What do we have to believe about Him in order to rest well in His work, even when it seriously hurts?



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
