The Priority of Prayer
March 7, 2021
Colossians 4:2-4

1. Have you ever found yourself to be inconsistent in prayer? What makes prayer challenging for you?
2. How does God's repeated call/invitation to prayer encourage you? What would be one step you could take toward being devoted to prayer?
3. Are "weak" and "dependent" words you enjoy being described as? Why do you think God is so comfortable with our relationship on these terms?
4. Read the Lord's Prayer together. What priorities do you see there, and how are they reflected in what Paul tells the Colossians to pray for?
5. If you prayed for things only God can do, what types of prayers would you pray? How would you pray for someone facing cancer or surgery or grief? Use the Prayer Guide, if helpful, and think specifically.
6. Will said this passage should be a family trip rather than a guilt trip. If your Father was really the King, how often would you ask Him for things, and what would you ask for? BONUS: If He really does open doors for the Gospel, how will that give us hope for Colossians 4:5-6 (next week!)?
