Song of Songs

1. What framed your childhood assumptions about sex? Was it private, taboo, sacred, good, bad, and/or confusing?
2. Will spoke of food and sex in marveling that our God is so kind and good as to make our duties such delights. Where else do you see this? How does it impact your view of and relationship with God?
3. Do you think it's true that all sex is covenantal, whether used within God's design for marriage or not? What would that mean, and how have you seen or experienced the reality of that - positively or negatively? BONUS: How has our culture turned this understanding of sex upside down?
4. Are struggles with sex generally the root of relational problems or the fruit (symptom)? What wisdom from Song of Songs helps us approach such struggles in our marriages and even personally?
5. Does the joy of Song of Songs make you uncomfortable? What wisdom can you personally take away from the beauty of sex before we approach the brokenness of it next week?
6. Will said we all long to be what we were created as - naked and unashamed - fully known and fully loved. How could someone pray for you to experience that in your life? Do you struggle to be known? Feel Loved? Both? What's the Gospel hope/comfort today for all of us?

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
